

#### **Revd. Canon Miriam writes:**

Dear Friends,

This year, Easter Day falls on one of the earliest dates possible (31<sup>st</sup> March). This means that no sooner have we celebrated The Presentation of Christ in the Temple (which marks the end of the Christmas and Epiphany season) and put the crib away, we are already on the cusp of the start of Lent which falls on 14<sup>th</sup> February. Unlike Christmas Day, Easter Day does not have the same date every year.

To understand this, we need to look to the moon!

Easter is based on the lunar cycles of the Jewish calendar. The Venerable Bede determined in 725AD that 'Easter Sunday always occurs on the first Sunday after the Paschal full moon.' (The word 'Paschal' is defined in the dictionary as relating to Passover or Easter). The Paschal Full Moon is the first Sunday following the full Moon that occurs on or after the Spring Equinox. This is why the date for Easter Sunday varies from year to year. The earliest date that Easter can be is 22<sup>nd</sup> March, the latest date is 25<sup>th</sup> April.

As always, we will start Lent with a service on Ash Wednesday at 7.30pm. This simple and reflective service provides an opportunity for you to set out and reflect on how you might journey through Lent. Often, people might abstain from something such as cake, alcohol, chocolate etc. to focus more on God. Sometimes, people may commit to deepening their faith through a regular pattern of reading scriptures or other Christian books, developing a more structured daily prayer routine or exploring for themselves a Rule of Life. Lent is a time of drawing nearer to God, of understanding God's love and the sacrifice made on our behalf by Jesus through his Crucifixion and the glorious truth of the redemption and hope that is ours through his Resurrection.

During Lent there will be an Ecumenical Lent Course led by the various churches in Croxley Green. The title of the course is 'A Christian Look at the Environment'. The course will take place on the following dates:

21 <sup>st</sup> February	at All Saints' Church
28 <sup>th</sup> February	at Croxley Baptist Church
6 <sup>th</sup> March	at St Oswald's Church
13 <sup>th</sup> March	at St Bede's Church
20 <sup>th</sup> March	at Croxley Methodist Church

There will be two identical sessions each day, one starting at 2pm and the other at 7.30pm. I do hope that you will be able to join us at all or some of these sessions.

In addition to this, we at All Saints' will also be exploring how we journey together and support one another developing our faith as a community and as individuals. More information about this will be available through my weekly letters, our website and Facebook page.

Another date that you may want to get in your diary is our next Quiet Church which will be on Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> February at 7.30pm.

As part of our desire to be an Inclusive Church we are hosting a talk about how to be a Dementia Friendly Church. This will be on Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> February at 2.30pm at All Saints'. It will be led by a representative from the Alzheimer's Society and our Parish Nurse Cathy and is open to everyone so do please come along and join us if you would like to find out more.

#### Report from PCC Meeting on 10th January 2024

#### The Church Organ

Some initial repair work has been done to improve the organ's performance. A further visit will be arranged to make further improvements and establish options for future larger-scale work.

#### The Sanctuary Carpet

The existing carpet will be replaced. It will be entirely funded by a generous private donation, for which the PCC is very grateful.

#### Charities to be supported during 2024

The PCC has voted to support the following charities:

#### **Review of the Electoral Roll 2024**

The PCC approved a timetable for the annual review of All Saints' Electoral Roll, which will take place in March and April. Those on the Roll will be entitled to attend and vote at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting on 28th April. For further details please speak to Chris Fagan, the Parish Electoral Roll Officer.

#### Living in Love and Faith – Blessings for Same Sex Partners

Miriam drew attention to the House of Bishops' approval of a measure to allow parish clergy, at their discretion, to conduct blessings for people in same sex relationships within the context of usual services. She would be happy to offer blessings at All Saints', perhaps at the end of the Sunday communion services and she wished to know what the PCC and members of the congregation thought about this approach. Revd. Paul agreed with Miriam on this matter and the PCC expressed support. Miriam would be pleased to hear the views of anyone who wishes to speak with her.

#### **Inclusive Church**

Revd. Paul invited the PCC to consider the idea of All Saints' becoming a member of the Inclusive Church network, which

encourages churches to be welcoming and affirming to everyone irrespective of disability, mental health issues, gender, sexuality. This would include dementia, on which an inter-church meeting will be held at All Saints' on 15th February at 2.30pm. The PCC agreed to consider the matter fully at its next meeting in March.

#### Revd. Paul Palmer

Miriam announced that, following the completion of his curacy, Paul will be licenced as assistant priest by Bishop Jane, the Bishop of Hertford, on Sunday 19th May. He will also remain at All Saints' as Assistant Priest. The PCC was delighted to hear this news.

As well as working in the UK with some of the most vulnerable children and their families, UNICEF works in some of the world's toughest places to reach the most disadvantaged children and adolescents – and to protect the rights of every child, everywhere. They work across more than 190 countries and territories to do whatever it takes to help children survive, thrive and fulfil their potential, from early childhood through adolescence.

They are one of the world's largest providers of vaccines and they support child health and nutrition, safe water and sanitation, quality education and skill building, HIV prevention and treatment for mothers and babies, and the protection of children and adolescents from violence and exploitation.

Before, during and after humanitarian emergencies, UNICEF will be there on the ground, bringing lifesaving help and hope to children and families. It has a non-political and impartial policy in the areas that it works but they are never neutral when it comes to defending children's rights and safeguarding their lives and futures.

#### All in the month of February...

#### It was:

150 years ago, on 15<sup>th</sup> Feb 1874 that Sir Ernest Shackleton was born. This Irish-born British polar explorer was one of the leading explorers during the Heroic Age of Antarctic Exploration. He led three British expeditions to the Antarctic.

100 years ago, on 5<sup>th</sup> Feb 1924 that BBC Radio broadcast the 'six-pips' Greenwich Time Signal for the first time.

also 100 years ago, on 12<sup>th</sup> Feb 1924 that George Gershwin's *Rhapsody in Blue* was performed for the first time, in New York.

90 years ago, on 23<sup>rd</sup> Feb 1934 that Edward Elgar, the British composer, died.

75 years ago, on 22<sup>nd</sup> Feb 1949 that Niki Lauda, Austrian racing driver was born. He was Formula One World Champion in 1975, 1977 and 1984. He was severely injured and burnt in a crash at the 1976 German Grand Prix. (Died 2019.)

70 years ago, on 23<sup>rd</sup> Feb 1954 that the first field test of the polio vaccine began in Pittsburgh. It grew into a year-long national trial involving 1.8 million children.

65 years ago, 3<sup>rd</sup> Feb 1959, became 'the day the music died', when American rock-and-roll performers Buddy Holly, Ritchie Valens and The Big Bopper were killed in a plane crash in Iowa.


60 years ago, on 7<sup>th</sup> Feb 1964 that the Beatles arrived in New York for their first US tour. They were met by thousands of screaming fans.

50 years ago, on 7<sup>th</sup> Feb 1974 that Conservative Prime Minister Edward Heath called a snap general election following the miners' strike and three-day week. It resulted in a hung parliament, and the Labour leader, Harold Wilson, became Prime Minister.

40 years ago, on 14<sup>th</sup> Feb 1984 that figure skaters Jayne Torvill and Christopher Dean won the gold medal in ice-skating at the Winter Olympics in Sarajevo. They scored the first perfect 6.0 in Olympic history.

- 30 years ago, on 25<sup>th</sup> Feb 1994 that serial killer Fred West was arrested in connection with the disappearance of his daughter. Police then discovered human bones buried in his garden. He was eventually charged with 11 murders, and his wife Rosemary with ten murders.
- 25 years ago, on 1<sup>st</sup> Feb 1999 that the International Maritime Organisation stopped using the Morse code 'SOS' distress call. All sea-going vessels were required to have a Global Maritime Distress and Safety System (GMDSS) fitted by this date.
- 20 years ago, on 4<sup>th</sup> Feb 2004 that Facebook, the social media networking platform, was launched.
- 15 years ago, on 7<sup>th</sup> Feb 2009 that the Black Saturday bushfires took place in Australia. The worst in Australia's history, they destroyed 1.1 million acres of land, killed 173 people, injured 414, and burned down more than 3,500 buildings, including 2,000 houses.



#### A Visit to the Harry Potter Studio



In the 2022 Christmas Grand Prize Draw we were lucky enough to win the family ticket to the Harry Potter Studio tour in Leavesden.

We decided that we would like to go during the winter 'Hogwarts in the Snow' season but all the tickets were sold out for winter 2022/23 so we booked our tickets for this

winter. After a long wait and watching many of the films again over Christmas, we finally went in January 2024. We had a lovely evening, visiting so many original sets, seeing many costumes and

learning behind the scenes secrets!

We walked through the Great Hall which was set up for a Christmas feast with huge Christmas trees around the room and the biggest wreaths we had ever seen. We saw





Hagrid's hut, Professor Sprout's greenhouse (where we could pull up a screaming mandrake), the Forbidden Forest which was covered in snow and was home to some enormous spiders (the hair on the spiders was made from the fibres from coconuts and was all applied by hand), Gringotts Bank, Platform 9 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> and the Hogwarts Express and Diagon Alley with all the shops in the films.

There was a fascinating section where we learned how the costumes, sets and creatures were made and animated. We learned that Voldemort's cloak was made of seven shades of green silk at the beginning, but as his powers diminished the shades decreased and his cloak became paler. Some of the mechanical conundrums were explained too, some of which were absolutely incredible.

As you may know, your local Companion Voices Group has been meeting for learning sessions at All Saints' for a year or two now. We go, on request, to sing for people at the end of their lives to provide comfort and support. The singing is entirely free, we are all volunteers.

Our Hertfordshire and Chilterns Group has been chosen by the Co-Op as one of their Local Community Causes for a year (November 2023 to November 2024). Every Co-Op member has the opportunity to choose their favourite community organisation to support for the year, and having done so, the Co-Op will donate 1% of any money that person spends on Co-Op products (including their Funeral care schemes) to the chosen organisation. If you ever shop there, every little bit would help. There is no cost to the individual person, but it could make a big difference to our Companion Voices Group. As well as bringing us some welcome funding, it will raise awareness of the service we offer and possibly attract new singers to join us as well.

#### Off to the vet






